The results are in and I am pleased to announce that the Old Oak Cliff Conservation League (OOCCL) has awarded Wynnewood North with a very generous neighborhood grant totaling \$2341.00! It is so rewarding to live in a community that so innovatively and proactively seeks ways to engage as many of our neighbors as possible, and the League agrees. As voted on by you at our last General Meeting, the funds will be used over the next 18 months to implement a number of exciting initiatives.

Key among these will be a social bruncheon for our senior citizens through a program called SSNOW (Supporting Senior Neighbors of Wynnewood), a series of children's swimming camp scholarships to be used at the Kidd Springs Park pool next Summer, and the funding of a children's bounce house in the greenbelt for next year's Spring Fling.

We have also received funds which allow us to upgrade our webhosting capabilities so that more of our event photos can be stored online and so that we ensure a properly functioning website and digital directory, in addition to money that will be used to cover the costs of the printed newsletters and the first printed directory in many years.

You will begin to see "Drive Like Your Kids Live Here" signage installed at strategic locations throughout the neighborhood in the coming weeks, and you may also notice improvements to the two triangles and to the reforestation of the greenbelt as we determine the best way to allocate our resources for beautification.

Congratulations on a very successful grant application, and thank you for voting for these exciting items!

What's next? When you are ready to spend money, you have two choices:

- Spend the money first and save all your receipts. Then you may present your receipts to the League for reimbursement, up to the amount of your Grant Award.
- Present an invoice, or a firm quote for your project. The League will issue a check that can be combined with your own monies to pay the invoice for your project.

Remember, the grant monies are available for two (2) years. We understand that it may take some time to set up the project and/or to raise your portion of the money. After that two-year period of time, you would need to apply again for a new grant.

When you are ready to request your pay-out, please be prepared to give us a report on your project. We'd like to hear what exactly was accomplished and how you think it contributed to the community. It would also be great to hear about any success stories, or challenges you overcame. This information could help other groups in the future. Please also include any photos or other documentation you may have. We may use these materials to publicize your achievement and the use of the grant money.

Feel free to contact the League with any questions you may have along the way.



Timely Tips for Summer Gardeners

FROM CALLOWAY'S AND CORNELIUS NURSERY

J uly is often a very dry month and can be very hot. The best time to do any kind of gardening or maintenance is in the early morning or late in the day after supper.

Proper watering is essential to keep plants healthy in the heat of summer. Water as deeply and infrequently as possible, as opposed to frequent light sprinklings. This will encourage a deeper root system that can take advantage of water stored in the soil.

To get shrubs and young trees through summertime dry spells, apply a thick layer of mulch over the root systems of plants. A three to four inch layer will prevent most evaporation from the soil and lower the soil temperature in the root zone. Drip irrigation combined with mulch is an excellent way to maintain high quality of plant materials

August is one of the driest months for our region.. It is the last month to plant a new lawn before winter temperatures arrive. Newly-installed lawns need at least six to eight weeks to establish a healthy root system. Prune roses back, but do not remove more than one-third of the plant. Prune and remove spent blooms on annuals and perennials to encourage continuous blooming well into fall.

September is the time to apply lawn fertilizer to keep the grass healthy and growing up to the first frost. Double check your sprinklers carefully to make sure they are applying all that you expect in an even, uniform pattern. Plant your fall vegetable garden. Plant cool-season vegetable garden with transplants of Broccoli, Cauliflower, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Chard, Collards, Lettuce and Kale.


