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Heritage Oak Cliff Offers Second Grant Cycle

Due to the fact that monies were still available for grants, the Executive Board of Heritage Oak Cliff decided to have another opportunity for neighborhoods to apply for grants. Wynnewood North had already applied and was awarded grants for: (1) Triangle Maintenance-\$1385.40, (2) Webhosting-\$712.80 and (3) Newsletter-\$1400.00.

For this Second Grant Cycle, Wynnewood North applied for: (1) Publishing of new directory-\$364.14 (2) Purchase of Pet microchip reader/scanner-\$225.00.

Wynnewood North has been fortunate in that for the past several years we were awarded every grant project we submitted an application for. Heritage Oak Cliff funds 60% of the costs of approved grant projects. Wynnewood North certainly appreciates their support.

There are still other criteria that must be met. The first criteria was obtaining the signatures. Thank you Katherine Hooker Espinoza!! I will keep the neighborhood informed as to the progress of this process.

Suspicious Activity

What is Suspicious Activity

Is it the empty plate on the counter with a couple of labs looking guilty?

Is it the egg on the sidewalk with Grand Kids running around the corner of the house?

Or is it a crime?

If a crime occurs – report it! It is estimated that only half of all crime is ever reported. Our Dallas police department can't do anything about crime if they don't know about it. If you are a victim of a crime, it is essential that you report it.

If you are a witness to a crime, it is just as important to report the crime as well. Eyewitness information is the key to solving most crimes. If you report a crime or suspicious activity, you do NOT have to be contacted by the responding police officer. If you choose to be contacted, it can be in person or the officer can contact you via telephone from their patrol vehicle.

The purpose for reporting suspicious activity is to prevent crime from occurring. The VIP in the area make regular patrols. But it's important for all of us to keep an eye out and remember these tips for reporting suspicious or criminal activity.

Call 911 immediately and report the suspicious activity or crime. Tell the 911 operator all that you remember about the incident. An incident may not always be a gunshot or stolen packages. In this neighborhood we all want to be kind to others. No one wants to get someone else in trouble. But sometimes we need to protect others from themselves. If you see someone noticeably under the influence or mentally unstable – call 911. The Police will take them in for protection.

If you do call 911 – things to tell the operator.

Who/What/When/Why

How many suspects are there? What clothing are they wearing?

Are weapons involved? Are they on foot or driving a vehicle? What model and make of vehicle?

License Plate?

Holiday Package Theft Prevention Tips

Wynnewood North, like many areas, is a target of porch thieves on a regular basis. With the holiday season approaching, it will only increase. Below are a few tips to help prevent this activity and keep your holiday happy!

- Have your package delivered to your work.
- Have your package delivered to the home of a relative or friend that you know will be home.
- Take advantage of "Ship to Store" option that many stores offer. Amazon offers a "locker" feature that allows you to pick up your package from a secure location.
- Request that your package has signature confirmation upon delivery.
- Ask your carrier to place package in an area out of plain view.
- Put a planter or some other large object on your porch that will hide packages
- If not at home, contact a trusted neighbor to retrieve your package

The Dallas Police Department (DPD) had put a hold on all VIP training classes since March due to Covid-19. DPD will be putting together a Zoom VIP Training class in November. If you want to give back to the neighborhood - get in touch with me at crime@wynnewoodnorth.org
In order to apply you must be a Dallas resident and;

- at least 21 years old
 - Have a valid Texas DL or ID card along with a social security card
 - Be a member of an established crime watch or neighborhood association
 - Never been convicted of a felony
 - No misdemeanor A or B convictions in the last 5yrs or DWI convictions in the last 10 yrs
- Must not have any outstanding tickets or warrants.



In order to get all of our new teammates signed up for November training meetings – we need to get the paperwork in by October 29th. Looking forward to helping folks watch out for their neighbors.

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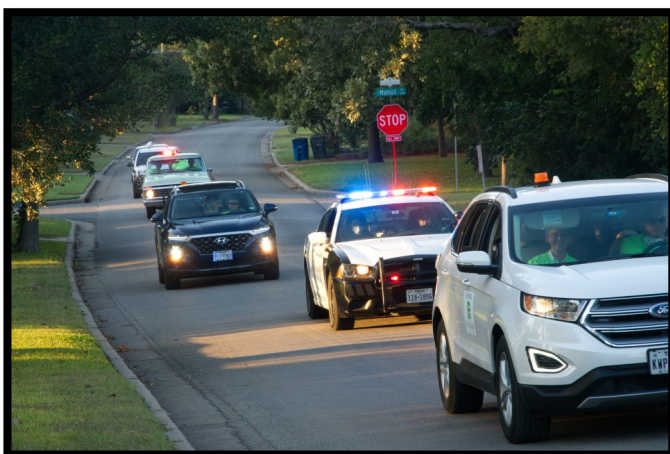
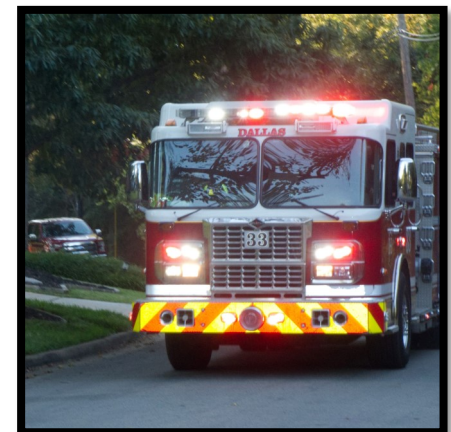
National Night Out

Neighbors watching out for Neighbors – the VIP

On Tuesday night, October 5th, you may have seen the firetrucks, police, and VIP cars driving through the neighborhood. This event is an offshoot of the Neighborhood Night Out program held on a Tuesday night in the fall. In the past, the VIP has invited our neighborhood to get out and meet each other with a BBQ, etc. We've always invited our civil servant friends at the fire and police departments. The pandemic has forced everyone to do things a bit differently – so the parade was our way of trying to get the neighborhood outside to thank our friends. We appreciate those who were able to get out and share their support to our friends in the police and fire departments.

The VIP (Volunteers in Patrol) program is an extension of the Crime Watch Program in Dallas. The main purpose of this program is to provide a VISIBLE presence in the neighborhood as a deterrent to criminal activity. That is the reason for the magnetic signs and flashing light on the roof of our cars. We want to be SEEN! Having concerned residents patrolling the streets in our own neighborhoods sends a clear message to everyone that crime will not be tolerated. Another purpose is to report suspicious or illegal activities to the police department to apprehend criminals. Our patrols allow each of you to have an active part in combating crime in their area. We DO NOT CONFRONT!

Wynnewood North is recognized as one of the more active VIP programs in the city. In order to maintain an active role in patrolling our neighborhood – we need some help. We have a lot of new neighbors that have moved to Wynnewood North. This is your chance to give back and take care of your investment. It only takes about 45 min to an hour for your patrol. Many folks just sign up for one or two patrols a month. I can pair individuals up together or you can come with your significant other. It isn't a big time commitment if we spread out our number of patrols among several friends and neighbors. Trust me – you will enjoy going out for a drive in your neighborhood. I've solved the worlds problems several times with Debbie. (Well we tried but no one listened)





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Wynnewood North Curb Address Painting Information

Neighbors have reached out in reference to updating their curb addresses. Many curb addresses that were previously painted throughout the entire neighborhood are fading. The company who originally painted our neighborhood curb addresses put together a website link for residents to individually make a request. This is a great deal and if neighbors take advantage of this will not only be for their benefit, but will help emergency responders identify immediately the address they were dispatched to if ever needed.

Wynnewood North residents may use the form on the link provided to request curb address painting(s) with the community design at a flat rate of \$20.00 (a savings of more than ½ off the standard rate).

Colorectal cancer survivor warns against ignoring symptoms

Two years ago, Alice Chapa was enduring chronic constipation and abdominal pain when she had a frightening discovery in the bathroom. "At that moment, I felt it," she says, recalling the bleeding that ultimately led her to seek medical help. The Oak Cliff woman's worst fear was realized: She had stage 3 colorectal cancer.

Her story – shrugging off the symptoms until the problem can't be ignored – is far too common, says Anand Lodha, MD, colorectal surgeon on the medical staff at Methodist Dallas Medical Center.

"People downplay the significance of what it could be when it's the colon and the rectum," Dr. Lodha says. "Patients automatically jump to 'Am I going to have a colostomy?' and that thought dominates the conversation. To the detriment of the patient, the symptoms get ignored."

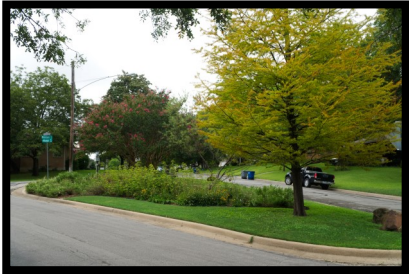

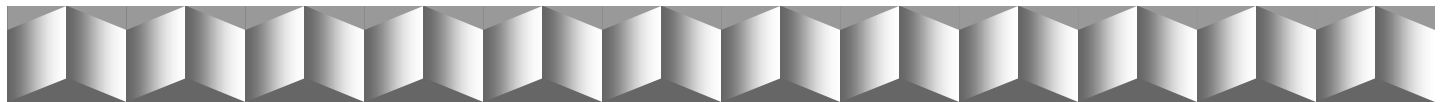

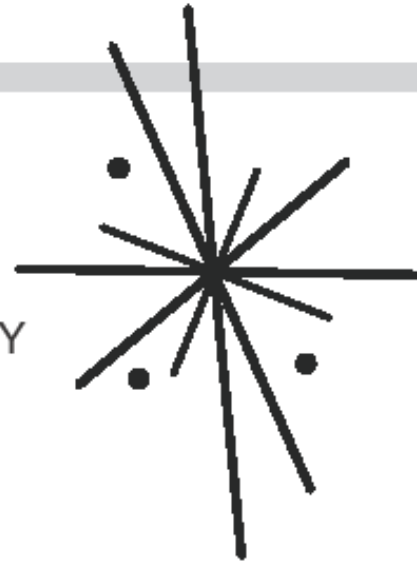
