

DIGITAL DIGEST - Email Scams

Welcome to Digital Digest! I have some disappointing news. There are people out there who will lie to you. I know, it's hard to believe - even though you're a very nice person – (everyone says so). But these people will lie to you all day long, and as well as lying, will steal from you, use your phone, your computer, and your email. And you may be one of those people who thinks other people are basically good and will treat people right. And if so, I'm sorry to add to the disappointment so quickly by telling you that you are just the kind of person they are hoping to find.

One way these criminals will go after your money is to trick you into giving them your private information: credit card numbers, bank account numbers, social security number, address book, passwords, etc. Another strategy is to persuade you to install software on your phone or computer which allows them to snoop around and take those same bits of private information. A more recent variation on this theme is to trick you into installing software which locks your computer, and then ask you to pay them to unlock it. This has happened not only to individuals, but also to large companies, government agencies, and complete cities.

But let's keep our focus on what you and I can do as regular people to reduce our chances of becoming a victim of one of these jerks. I mentioned address books above. One strategy to trick you can be to make you think an email has come from a trusted source: a personal friend, your bank, or a government agency such as the IRS or Social Security. It's possible your friend has been a victim and his address book was stolen. A criminal might use his or her name and your email from their address book to write you a little message. Some of these are ridiculous – you might get an email from a person you haven't seen in years, which has a weird subject, like "Look at This!", and in the body of the email there's nothing but a link that says "unbelievable

photos". Easy to spot – don't click that link or download the attachment! But there are other emails that look very convincingly like an email from say, Amazon, with all the proper logos and graphic design, that says you owe \$72.68 on an outstanding bill. What?! I don't owe them \$72.68! I'd better look at this bill and see what the heck this is about! Click! Whoops! In a scam like this, when you click, they might show you a page that looks just like your normal Amazon sign in page, and ask you to enter your email and Amazon password. Once you do that, they have it and can go on a shopping spree. Or the link could be a virus or evil bit of software that opens the door for them to steal what they like. Neither of these is good. So, we have to be watchful and look for things that don't seem right:


- 1. Is the source of this email someone I email with regularly, or is it "out of the blue"? If the email source is someone you know, is the content of the email strange, or is the style of writing unusual for them?
- 2. Is their email address not quite right? (if you get an email from me that's from webmaster@wynnewoodmorth.org, it's not from me do you see the "m"?
- 3. Banks, IRS, Medicare and Social Security will all tell you they will NEVER email or phone you and ask for your password or PIN.
- 4. If you get an email or call supposedly from your bank that seems suspicious, instead of following the link in the email, call the number on the back of your credit card or bank statement and talk to the fraud department to find out if this contact is real or not.
- 5. Do not cooperate with any unverified contact that asks you to wire money, buy gift cards, or enter your account numbers.
- 6. In general, if there is anything about an email that raises suspicion, do not click links, open attachments, or reply.

A Few Good People Needed





Package Thieves and Car Break Ins are on the rise in Oak Cliff. We need your help in keeping those numbers down in our wonderful neighborhood.

The VIP (volunteers in Patrol) program is an extension of the Crime Watch Program in Dallas. The main purpose of this program is to provide a VISIBLE presence in the neighborhood as a deterrent to criminal activity. That is the reason for the magnetic signs and flashing light on the roof of our cars. We want to be SEEN! Having concerned residents patrolling the streets in their own neighborhoods sends a clear message to everyone that crime will not be tolerated. Another purpose is to report suspicious or illegal activities to the police department to apprehend criminals. Our patrols allow each of you to have an active part in combating crime in our neighborhood. We DO NOT CONFRONT!

Wynnewood North is recognized as one of the more active VIP programs in the city. In order to maintain an active role in patrolling our neighborhood – we need some help. We have a lot of new neighbors that have moved to Wynnewood North. This is your chance to give back and take care of your investment. It only takes about 45 min to an hour for your patrol. Many folks just sign up for one or two patrols a month. I can pair individuals up together or you can come with your significant other. It isn't a big time commitment if we spread out our number of patrols among several friends and neighbors. Trust me – you will enjoy going out for a drive in your neighborhood. I've solved the worlds problems several times with Debbie. (Well we tried but no one listened) And the middle grand child wants to know when we get to put the light on the car.

In order to apply you must be a Dallas resident and;

- \Rightarrow at least 21 years old
- ⇒ Have a valid Texas DL or ID card along with a social security card
- ⇒ Be a member of an established crime watch or neighborhood association
- ⇒ Never been convicted of a felony
- ⇒ No misdemeanor A or B convictions in the last 5 yrs or DWI convictions in the last 10 yrs
- ⇒ Must not have any outstanding tickets or warrants.

There will be a training meeting on November 19th. In order to get all of our new teammates signed up for November training meetings – we need to get the paperwork in by October 31st. We are looking forward to helping folks watch out for their neighbors.

Crime Tips I David Williams

Carjacking and Break Ins #1 crime in North Wynnewood Area

The Wynnewood VIP patrol continually monitors crime in the surrounding area. Package thieves are notorious, brazen, and downright disgusting. The VIP do a great job of hiding packages for you - but carjacking and break ins have been the number one crime in the zip codes surrounding this area. Not only has it been the number one crime reported – your lives can be endangered. There are several things that make your vehicle attractive to thievesincluding make, model and the value of certain parts. Know that it's not always the most valuable, the flashiest or the most expensive car makes and models that are most desirable. So whatever your car, don't make it convenient for would-be criminals. Take these precautionary measures—and check with your insurer; some may even help lower your premium. ☐ Keep your doors locked and windows

minutes.

Make valuables invisible. Don't give thieves more motivation to break into your car. If you must leave personal property in your car, keep it in the trunk. Even in areas you think are safe, don't leave a purse or other valuables on the car seat unattended.

Park in secure, highly trafficked, and well-lit areas. In public parking garages like the grocery store

shut anytime you're not in your car, even for a few

parking lot, stay as close as possible to store entrances. Also, if possible, always lock the door to your home garage. A good idea might be to back your car into the driveway. SUV back seats and tail gates on trucks are still the most popular items stolen.

I Make use of anti-theft devices. Use a security device like a steering wheel lock or a gearshift column lock—the more difficult it is to take the car, the less likely a would-be thief will target your vehicle. Most new cars include tracking devices, which can help locate a stolen car, but these are available for purchase and installation into older cars, as well. Check with your insurance pro about how your anti-theft device might qualify you for a discount.

Exploit your vehicle identification (VIN) number. The VIN number is utilized by several law enforcement agencies and databases and insurance databases to make it harder for car thieves to sell a stolen car or its parts. The VIN is usually found on the dashboard on the driver's side of the car. Mark your VIN prominently: Use paint or an indelible marker to put the VIN under the engine hood and trunk lid and on the battery. This will make it harder for thieves to unload the car, and make it easier for the police to identify the vehicle if recovered. If the worst happens and your car is stolen, you'll want to file a police report. Then check that your policy covers car theft and get the claims process started. Notify your insurance professional about the incident as soon as possible—the longer you wait, the harder it will be to remember the details. Note that many insurance companies now use mobile apps, which can help you get the claims filing process started immediately.

Prevent carjacking

Although carjacking is relatively rare, because carjackers are armed when they commit their crimes, it is especially dangerous. Avoid being a carjacking target with these additional precautions:

Always have your mobile phone handy—and

☐ Avoid being alone in your vehicle in certain are	;-

☐ When pumping gas – keep your keys with you.☐ Be aware of your surroundings.

☐ Be wary of how carjackers lure victims. These include bumping your car, pretending to be stranded motorists or flashing their lights as if there were something wrong with your car.

☐ Practice safe parking. Stick to well-lit areas. If you have any doubts about where you parked after the fact, find a security guard to accompany you to your vehicle.

☐ Don't sit in your car with the door unlocked or the windows rolled down, especially at traffic lights.

☐ Don't stop at isolated ATMs.

☐ Stay alert – be suspicious of people asking directions

☐ Let someone know of your planned route.








TEXpress Lanes



In May of this year Chad West and the Dallas City Council voted unanimously to approve the Humane Pet Store Ordinance. This new law, which takes effect in November, was championed by the HSUS and the Texas Humane Legislation Network. It will ban the sale of puppies and kittens in Dallas pet stores, opening the way for more of our adoptable animals to find homes.

It is widely known that reputable breeders do not sell their animals in pet stores, because they want to make sure that the little ones are going to good homes. In fact, according to the Humane Society, 95% of the puppies and kittens sold in U.S. pet stores come from intensive breeding facilities called puppy mills. We have all seen coverage of puppy mill busts on the news. Well, most of the pet stores advertising their AKC registered puppies get them from facilities that are every bit as horrendous as those we have seen on TV.

While Dallas continues to grapple with a pet overpopulation problem, we can be thankful that one part of the puppy mill pipeline has been closed. Kudos to the Dallas City Council, and thanks to our friends at HSUS and THLN!


