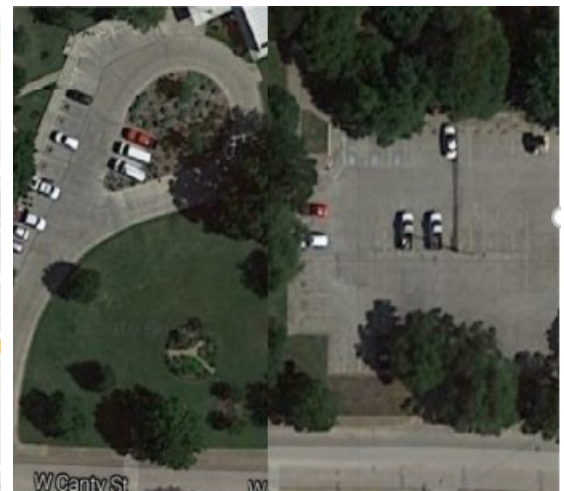
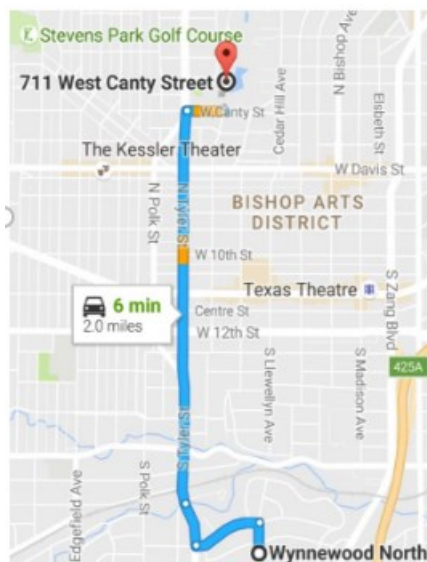

Wynnewood North Crime Watch Team Honored by Dallas Police Department

On March 28th, the Dallas Police Department honored their Volunteers from throughout the city. I was honored to represent our neighborhood at the banquet. Our VIP team was named as the top VIP group in the city. We provided nearly 400 patrols in 2023!

Our 2024 goals are progressing nicely. We have 4 new VIPs certified and ready to go. We have been able to provide patrols almost every day so far this year. We have had 80 patrols for the first three months this year, and 7 reported crimes. The rash of backyard shed and garage break-ins we experienced in February and early March seem to have stopped, hopefully due to requesting extra patrols.



The VIP program began in 2009 with about 20 members that underwent training in January. The first recorded patrol occurred on February 13, 2009, by Donna Libby and Pam Westerheide. The team grew again in 2010, and we provided 221 patrols that year! Last year, the team made 367 trips through the neighborhood hiding packages, notifying neighbors of open garage doors, and recording suspicious activities.

In 2009, most of our team were working and many of our patrols occurred during the evenings. Now, most of us have retired and enjoy spending parts of our daytime hours riding through the streets of Wynnewood North. So we are really in need of new folks to step up, be certified and patrol in the evenings! It's a great time to catch up with a friend or your spouse. You can listen to music or the ballgame, scope out future Yard of the Month winners, and reward yourself with a run to Sonic for a Hot Fudge Sundae when you're finished!

Be Aware: Motor Vehicle Thefts Increase

We have seen a rise in the number of motor vehicle theft incidents over the past year, with most of the incidents occurring in Wynnewood Village. There are steps you can take to help prevent vehicle thefts, including:

- * Always **lock your vehicle and take your keys**, both at night and even when just parking for a few minutes at your house—half of cars stolen or broken into were left unlocked or with a window open.
- * **Never leave valuables in your vehicle!!** If you absolutely have to, be sure valuables are never left where they are visible to someone from the outside. If there is nothing visible to be stolen, most thieves will skip your vehicle (actual car thefts are rare, but break-ins are common).
- * **Park in a well-lit area.** Car thieves avoid places they can be seen.
- * **Keep tailgates locked with factory or auxiliary locks.** Pickup truck tail gate thefts are extremely common. Ensure you are locking your tailgate and consider adding an auxiliary lock, which can be purchased at auto parts stores.

Wynnewood Village Update

Statement from Brixmor Representative:

You will see coming soon signs going up soon to announce Burlington, Capital One (bank) Café, and James Avery Artisan Jewelers. We have more deals in the works and look forward to sharing updates as we execute more leases!


Wynnewood Village Special Provision Sign District (new signage for Wynnewood Village) - The proposed Wynnewood Village SPSD was approved by City staff and the Special Sign District Advisory Committee (SSDAC) in January and during the City Plan Commission on March 21st. Next the application will go to City Council in May. If approved, we would look to install new signage in early 2025.

This new site-specific signage ordinance will allow for refreshed signage throughout the shopping center and will enhance the pedestrian and wayfinding experience for our neighbors and visitors. The vintage pylon from the 50's in the heart of Wynnewood Plaza will be kept and refurbished as needed.

For the neighbors that live on the outer perimeter of Wynnewood Village that received a letter with map included in reference to the Special Provision Sign District information -- This map is showing the outline of the properties we were legally required to provide individual notices to as part of our application for the Special Provision Sign District. The "striped" property is Wynnewood Village, with the dotted line indicating the notice radius.

NOTE: Contact Denise Requardt, WNNA President, for any questions and/or if anyone would like to see the proposed conditions and presentation from the Masterplan to get a feel for what has been presented to achieve for signage for a new Wynnewood Village.

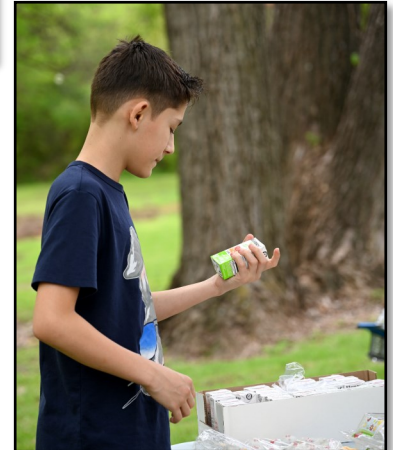

The Odd Couple of 439 N. Manus

They are an odd couple - Lily Mae, the 15-year old Siamese princess, and Iris, the big, beautiful court jester monkey girl.

Lily Mae was a stray who showed up on the front porch of one of my coworkers in 2009. She's a seal-point with beautiful blue eyes, who moves quietly, hides from strangers, and in general is very regal and reserved. The only times we see her angry are when she has to submit to the vet. Being poked, prodded, and felt around on is not appropriate behavior when you're dealing with a princess. She communicates this by becoming a snarling, clawing demon from Hell ready to spill the blood of any feline health professional who enters her space. We've had more than one vet experience this and say "You know, she looks pretty healthy to me - let's skip this part".



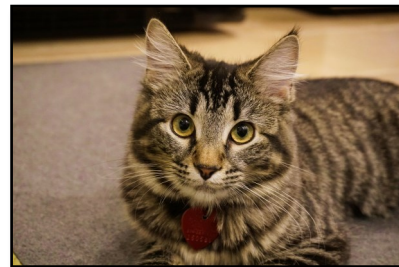
Like many Siamese, she is vocal - one of her rituals is to retrieve a favorite toy from the toy basket in the dark of night, and sing the song of her people for a few minutes before leaving the toy in the bedroom doorway as an offering. This may happen two or three times in a night, and at our house is known as "kitty opera".

Lily Mae has a highly developed internal clock and knows when it's time for her evening kitty treats. She refuses to bow to daylight savings time, and will hound us until treats are shared. She also has strong

opinions about when it's bedtime, and will again let us know if we're staying up too late.

At her age, warmth, brushing, and cuddling time are very important to her, and she has places and times during her day that are preferred for cuddling with each of us.

In 2016, our vet was looking for homes for a litter of kittens. The staff there knew us well, and knew that one of our cats had passed a few months before. We agreed to take a kitten. We were told they had picked the one for us which had the "big personality". They were not kidding! She was an adorable, tiny kitten with a huge brushy tail out of proportion to her body. We don't know anything about her background, but she has some characteristics of a Maine Coon: Big ears, lush long hair, a big ruff around her neck. It took a while, but she eventually grew into that huge tail. She's now a big, beautiful girl, who has kept that big personality. She's just about the opposite of Lily Mae in temperament. Big, a little clumsy, and never met a stranger. She's the life of the party and wants to be in the big middle (literally) of wherever the action is. She may jump into your lap and smell your face to check you out, before launching herself off your lap to check out her next distraction. As a kitten, she was as curious and hyperactive as an organ grinder monkey. She had a mean streak, and if you tried to say, take her off the kitchen counter, she would fight you and hold a grudge.



Fortunately, since she's grown up, she's mostly grown out of her manic personality and become a bit more of a normal cat. Her nickname is the "hound dog" because she likes to be in the room with you but

just napping in the corner. If you move, she will follow and find an appropriate corner in the new room. In between hound dog periods, she may jump her big body up into your lap and roll over to indicate that it's tummy rubbin' time, right now! She is one of those who must try on every box and paper bag to check the fit. She has napping spots all over the house: in the laundry basket, on a shelf in various closets, on a chair at the dining table - she's very creative.

Especially during Iris' monkey-like kittenhood, Lily Mae was at her wits' end - how and why was this tiny, obnoxious creature so loud, so annoying, so in her face? For a while, she just hissed whenever Iris careened into the room, just on general principles. Fortunately, as time has passed, the two of them have found advantages to having a sister: mutual grooming, a warm nap companion when it's chilly out, and companionship in general.

We adore them both. It's hard to describe how much these two little personalities add to our household, but fortunately the many pet owners in Wynnewood North already understand this.

Get ready!! It's time to start planning for the upcoming Shop the Woods Community Sale in Wynnewood North and Elmwood neighborhoods

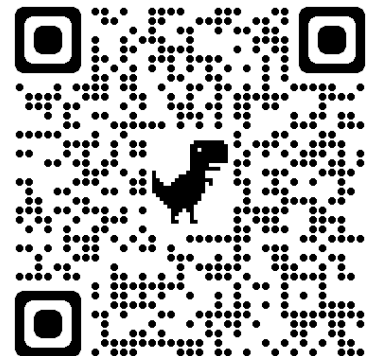

Cutting back on alcohol has become a year-round pursuit for some, no longer constrained by “Dry January” or “Sober October,” and health experts consider that a big win.

“Alcoholism is on the rise in more women and in younger populations,” says Ashwini Mehta, DO, transplant hepatologist on the medical staff at Methodist Dallas Medical Center. “Now, post-pandemic, people are becoming more mindful about what they’re putting into their bodies.”

Excess drinking can cause long-term damage to the brain, liver, heart, pancreas, stomach, and kidneys, so it’s no wonder that nonalcoholic beer and mocktails are in demand post-pandemic.

For those drinkers hoping to cut back, mocktails can serve as a suitable alternative without the health concerns. Even a 30-day break, a so-called “dry month,” can be beneficial in the moment and in the long run.

Treasurer's Report for Q1

We began the year with \$12,806 and have received \$628 in contributions through the first quarter of 2024. Expenditures have amounted to \$7,106 for an ending total of \$6,328. One of the major expenditures in the quarter was the completion of the new and beautiful flagstone pad at the Monssen triangle. This project was managed by Cynthia Michaels and was made possible by a generous grant provided by Heritage Oak Cliff.

We also completed Phase 1 of the "75 for 75" Reforestation program headed by Mike Wicker and James Tekippe. The first 25 (of 75) beautiful trees were planted throughout Wynnewood North. The program is slated to run for another two years when 50 more trees will be planted during the Winter of 2024 and 2025. Again, huge thanks to our friends at Heritage Oak Cliff for their continued support of our terrific neighborhood.

Please plan on joining us for the upcoming Spring Wander, which is our first big fundraiser for the year. We have three terrific houses for you to tour. This is a wonderful event and a great chance to meet your neighbors!

Time to Conserve Water!

Irrigation of landscaped areas with hose-end sprinklers or automatic irrigation systems is limited to no more than twice per week according to the MANDATORY Twice-Weekly Watering Schedule. No watering is allowed on Mondays, Tuesdays or Fridays and from April 1-October 31, watering is prohibited between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. on all days of the week, including the allowed watering days. Drip irrigation, soaker hoses and hand watering are allowed on any day and at any time.
