If you feed free-roaming cats, please ensure they are spayed or neutered, as neighbors did 14 years ago for Sherman, one of our neighborhood feral cats.

Big Fix for Big D provides spay or neuter surgeries and vaccinations for free-roaming cats living in the Big Fix for Big D zip codes. This service is free, but please consider a donation so Big Fix can help others.

Big Fix for Big D will help you trap the cats, spay or neuter them, vaccinate them for rabies and clip the tip of one ear to signify that they are fixed, free-roaming cats.

Sterilizing these cats is the most humane and effective way to stop the growth of these colonies.

The feral cats must be transported in a trap to one of the facilities. If you need access to a trap, transporting a cat to the spay or neuter facility, or general questions;

#### Timely Tips for Spring Gardeners

FROM CALLOWAY'S AND CORNELIUS NURSERY

A pril begins our beautiful spring weather, so get out your gardening tools and get moving. Calloway's and Cornelius Nursery are fully stocked with all kinds of plants and products for all your gardening needs. Consider adding Native Plants to your landscape. Native plants tolerate the Texas summer heat, require less water, less mowing, and provide habitats for birds, butterflies and other wildlife.

A successful garden begins with good soil. Organic material is important to the soil composition. It helps with drainage and increases the microbe population. Expanded shale is used to break up hard compacted clay soils. Top dress your flowerbeds and containers with organic mulches.

As the weather gets warmer, grass will grow faster. Keep up with the mowing so you don't have to bag the clippings. That may mean mowing every five or six days instead of every seven to ten days. Allowing the clippings to fall back into the lawn recycles the nutrients but does not promote thatch. Mow frequently at the correct height to promote a healthy, weed resistant turf.

As spring rains slack off and give way to drier days, apply supplemental water as needed. The rule of thumb is to water enough to wet the soil five to six inches deep. Do not water too frequently. Frequent watering promotes a shallow root system that is more susceptible to the stress of summer heat and winter cold.




#### From the Communications Chairman
