C. Beautification – Jeremy Ratliff

Yard of the Month: No yard was selected for January Yard of the Month.

Neighborhood Clean-Up: The annual neighborhood clean-up is usually held in March. A flyer will be distributed once a date is set.

A “mini clean-up” is scheduled for Feb. 4 (weather permitting) to clean the triangles and prepare them for new plantings.

Subcommittee: Volunteers are needed to help execute the plans developed to receive the grant from the Old Oak Cliff Conservation League.

D. Crime Watch – Mary Scherer

The following crime updates were reported:

- November-December 2005: only nine reported offenses
 - January 2006: no offenses reported to date
- (These statistics do not include the Wynnewood Village shopping center)

Random gun fire was reported on New Year’s Eve. This has become a commonplace occurrence. Neighbors are encouraged to call 911 to report it, but it will not be a priority for authorities.

Mary offered several tips to prevent auto thefts:

- Pull cars into the driveway instead of parking it on the street
- Improve lighting in the yard and driveway
- Keep the garage door closed

Graffiti has been reported in the area. Please be sure to wait until authorities have taken photos and reports before you take measures to remove the graffiti.

There has been positive evidence of police making good response time and taking reports and security alarms seriously.

E. Treasurer’s Report – Tom Reeves



The year-end 2005 report states a balance of \$7,106.16 as of January 1, 2006. Income in 2005 was reported at \$6,322.00 and expenses in 2005 were reported at \$6,954.00. Costs have increased due to landscaping maintenance of triangles.

Quarterly meetings and Wynnewood Wanders are major sources of donations and fundraising. It is vital to keep these events going in order to keep neighborhood projects moving.

November report: Income of \$235 and expenses of \$413 left a balance of \$6473. Jan Scott made a motion to approve the report. Doug Norton seconded the motion. The motion carried.

December report: Income of \$1,743 and expenses of \$1,280 left a balance of \$6240. Lisa Tully made a motion to approve the report. Mary Scherer seconded the motion. The motion carried.

F. Vice President – Greg Gormley

Neighbors are encouraged to join the Old Oak Cliff Conservation League. This organization shares information with the Dallas community at large about the Oak Cliff area. Their goal is to enhance communication between neighborhoods within Oak Cliff.

The OOCCL is looking for volunteers and homes for the 2006 Tour of Homes in the fall. WNNA has had several homes on the tour over the year.

G. Communications – Lisa Tully

Additional Block Captain volunteers are needed for the following areas:

Responsibilities include distributing newsletters and flyers and welcoming new neighbors on your block.

III. OPEN DISCUSSION



A. Street Closure on Llewellyn: No additional steps have been taken since the October 2005 general meeting. The concerns and questions raised at that meeting and with other communications will be passed to the 2006 board. The entire neighborhood's involvement on this matter is encouraged. All concerns will be given due consideration. The board has pursued this matter only as the result of neighbor suggestions.

A question was raised from the floor about steps being taken now to prevent crime and speeding, such as speed bumps and crime watch signs. Crime Watch Chair Mary Scherer explained that these items have been and will continue to be considered. She added that acquiring speed bumps in a neighborhood is a difficult process.
